Emblem



The Emblem of the 2_{nd} Asian Youth Games depicts four representative elements of the City of Nanjing: mountains, rivers, city walls and tree leaves as well as the "Red Sun" logo of the Olympic Council of Asia. The composition of the Emblem, painted in Chinese calligraphy, is a vivid representation of an athlete and in the form of the Chinese character "Ning" (abbreviation for the name of Nanjing) in the sunlight. The entiree Emblem is bright in colours and is full of motion and energy.



Mascot



The Official Games Mascot, named "Ya Qing Yuan Yuan" in Chinese is derived from the "dawn monkey of China". The species was first discovered in a remote area of Jiangsu and was one of the first known primates. The design of the mascot was inspired by the "Red Sun" logo of the Olympic Council of Asia. Rounded lines are applied to form the

monkey's face and its tail is delineated with the patterns of rain flower stones (a special local product also known as Yuhua stone). The Mascot is passionate and uniquely combines the heritage of the city, the vitues of the Games and the vibrancy of youth. It also reflects the Nanjing citizens' hopes for the Games and the warm welcome they extend to all new friends and guests from Asian countries and regions.

Climate

Nanjing locates in the north subtropical monsoon climate zone, which has four distinct seasons with the obvious feature that hot in summer and cold in winter.

The tennis competition of the 2nd Asian Youth Games, Nanjing 2013 (Abbreviation "AYG Nanjing 2013") will consist of three (3) events.

Men's Singles Women's Singles Mixed Doubles



Competition Rules

The tennis competition of AYG Nanjing 2013 shall be conducted in accordance with the International Tennis Federation (ITF) Rules of Tennis 2013 and relevant regulations and rules, in force during the Games time.

Pursuant to the OCA Constitution and Rules, the technical delegate appointed by ATF assumes the responsibility for the technical control and direction of tennis competition of AYG Nanjing 2013.

In case of any disagreement in the interpretation of the regulations and rules, the English version shall prevail. Any unforeseen cases not covered by the regulations and rules shall be handled with relevant measures adopted by the technical delegate.

Competition Format

All Singles and Mixed Doubles matches shall be the best of three tiebreak sets in a knock-out system.

Draw

The positions in the draw shall be decided by the draw of lots.

The time and place for the Draw Ceremony will be two (2) day before the event in the competition venue.

Entry Timeline

The First Entry (Entry by Sport)

Deadline: 24:00 on October 8, 2012 (Beijing Time).



The Second Entry (Entry by Number)

Deadline: 24:00 on April 15, 2013 (Beijing Time).

The Third Entry (Entry by Name)

Deadline: 24:00 on June 25, 2013 (Beijing Time).

Eligibility

- 1. Only NOCs recognized by the OCA may enter athletes of its citizenship in AYG Nanjing 2013.
- 2. To be eligible for participation in AYG Nanjing 2013, an athlete must comply with the OCA Constitution and Rules, as well as with the rules of ATF and must be entered by his/her NOC.
- 3. Any athlete in AYG Nanjing 2013 must be a national of the country/region of the NOC that is entering him/her.

Athlete's Age Restriction

Birth date should be January 1, 1996 - December 31, 1999.

Entry Policies

Each participating NOC may enter a maximum of two (2) male athletes and two (2) female athletes.

Singles Events: Each participating NOC may enter a maximum of two (2) athletes per event.

Mixed Events: Each participating NOC may enter two (2) pairs of athletes for Mixed Doubles.

An athlete may enter singles and another events.

Technical Officials

The Technical Delegate appointed by ATF is responsible for making suggestions on all technical matters and Tennis competition operation.

The Technical Officials of tennis competition of AYG Nanjing 2013 will be jointly appointed by ATF, NAYGOC and CTA. They include:

NOCs and shall be appointed by ATF.

Protests and Appeals

On-court disputes shall be settled by the chair umpires. The chair umpire is the final authority on all questions of the fact during the match.

On questions of the tennis rules, the athletes can appeal to the referee, whose decision shall be final.

Any protest/appeal concerning on athletes' qualification and other major issues will be solved by Jury.

Equipment and Clothing

Equipment used and clothing worn by athletes and other relevant participants in Tennis must comply with ITF and OCA Constitution and Rules.

Doping Control

Doping Control during AYG Nanjing 2013 will be conducted in accordance with OCA Anti-Doping Rules applicable to AYG Nanjing 2013 and will follow the standards and procedures under the World Anti-Doping Programme.



Victory Ceremony

Gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded to the athletes or pairing ranked the top three (3) of each event respectively.

Before the Victory Ceremony, the medalists shall be escorted to the waiting area to get ready for the ceremony. Medalists must wear their NOC racing uniforms or NOC official uniforms.

Media

Mixed Zone

Mixed zone will be set up in the competition venue to facilitate interactions between athletes and the media. Athletes must pass through the mixed zone after finishing their competitions.

Sport Information Services

All Sport–specific information for Tennis of AYG Nanjing 2013 will be available at the sport information desks. They will be located at Sport Information Center (SIC) in the Athletes' Village and the competition venue respectively.

The desks will provide information such as competition schedules, training schedules, results, Tennis related information and communications between the ATF and NOCs. Moreover, the SIC will provide information on transport, etc.
